The last two years have been a time of hardship and change for so many people all over the world, especially for those in education as their progress has been disrupted so much. It is as true in The Gambia as anywhere else but we are doing our utmost to help where we can.

I have been blessed to have been part of SSS long enough to see the fruits of what we have done. It has not all been plain sailing and we have had challenges along the way with students dropping out or getting married and one tragically dying, but it has been wonderful to see the successes and to watch those students go from strength to strength.

In these difficult times it is very easy for us to focus on ourselves and how things are affecting us. It sometimes helps to try and see how it is affecting others. We are being told not to travel and that holidays abroad are an unnecessary luxury which they may be, but in The Gambia, where a large portion of the population relies on tourism, people are starving and education takes second place when you are struggling to feed your family. Hungry children are becoming involved in criminal activities to find food for their families.

Each one of you who supports us is having a very positive impact on someone else's life. You are giving someone you have not met a positive chance at life and it is interesting to see that many of them pay it forward by helping others.

We need your help more than ever before, more children and young people require assistance with their education in these troubled times, so please continue to support us, and share this letter with friends who may be interested in giving support or consider fundraising for us. The Triplets

The triplets were actually quadruplets. They are called Maimuna, Fatoumata and Sarjo. There was one other sibling Sohna, but sadly she passed away. They were born prematurely in the 21st January 2017 and they come from a village called Busumbala. The country was in chaos at the time as the dictator President had just been voted out in the elections and was being deported that day, so the first days of their lives were precarious. Their mother was unable to feed them all and their diet had to be supplemented with powdered milk which is very expensive for a family with an unexpected increase in numbers! Their mother was unable to work as the triplets took up all of her time so it has been a difficult time for the family. They are now ready for school and there are 3x uniforms, books, school bags and lunches to budget for so their father sought the help of Fatou for their education and we have agrees to help them. It will cost about £110 per child per year. The cost of living is rising in The Gambia as well as other places so if you could help in any way, we would be very grateful.

Thank you so much for making me proud.







New Update

The clinic continues to be very well run by nurse Ceesay who retired from Government service as a midwife. We continue to work closely with the Gambian Health services and regular ante natal and post natal clinics are held.

The Government recently donated an ambulance to the area which relieves the pressure on the Gambia Horse and Donkey Trust drivers and vehicles. Progress is being made now, the roads are improving and the people in the rural communities not only have access to this primary care clinic, but it is generally easier to reach the main centres if patients are referred.

We are trying to make the clinic as sustainable as possible and drugs are paid for from the small fees made by patients for their treatments. We still cover the salaries and maintenance costs out of your donations and will need to do so for the foreseeable future so we would really appreciate any support that you can give us, particularly as a regular gift to enable us to budget to provide maintenance and to improve our facilities.

This little clinic has been, and continues to be, a life line in this remote little corner of The Gambia and community health has improved and lives have been saved thanks to the generosity of our supporters. **THANK YOU!**
